In Los Angeles County, more than 27,000 children are found to be abuse or neglected, according to the Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children. More importantly, the aim to curb and prevent child abuse among Asian American and Pacific Islander is critical in the changing trends of population growth in Los Angeles County.

With growing Asian American and Pacific Islander communities in Southern California, particularly in San Gabriel Valley, the **API Child Youth and Families Council (API CYFC)** is committed to bringing to light the needs of AAPI communities, especially since many of these communities may be stereotypically dismissed because of the model minority myth. The Council's focus is on **child abuse prevention** among AAPI communities, and is a member and affiliate of the larger Los Angeles Child Abuse councils and Los Angeles Department of Children and Family Services. The Council is comprised of several AAPI service organizations.

The Council has developed a child abuse prevention PSA to be aired in the months of April (child abuse month) and May (API heritage month).
