Summary: Under the direction of the Youth Services Coordinator and the supervision of the Afterschool Program Lead, the Middle School Instructor is a direct service position responsible for facilitating, coordinating, implementing and supervising academic and enrichment services for middle-school age youth. Performance is reviewed on a continuous basis with specific goals and objectives identified throughout the year. This is a part-time, non-exempt position working at least 17 hours per week. The schedule for this position Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 2:00pm-6:00pm and Tuesdays from 1:00pm-6:00pm, with occasional extended hours on weeknights for special events.

Duties / Responsibilities:

- **Coordinate and facilitate academic and enrichment services for middle school-aged youth by:**
 - Providing instructional activities, homework and academic assistance, and other support to middle-school age youth;
 - Facilitating workshops for middle-school age youth on topics such as: healthy relationships, communication, gangs, etc.;
 - Overseeing classroom management: supervising participants and manage volunteers to ensure quality of services;
 - Communicating with Supervisor and parents regarding student achievement and/or areas of concern; and
 - Providing programmatic oversight and management of volunteers.
- **Prepare & submit assigned internal & contractual monthly reporting in a timely manner by:**
 - Monitoring, reporting, and documenting participant and/or program performance; and
 - Implementing student assessment and logging performance.
- **Attend relevant meetings, trainings, events and activities; and**
- **Perform other related duties as assigned by the Supervisor or Youth Services Manager.**

Minimum Requirements / Qualifications (All applicants MUST meet the minimum qualifications):

- Bachelor's degree in Education, Psychology, Sociology or other-related field from an accredited College or University **OR** an AA degree and two years of experience working with academic and/or enrichment programming;
- Knowledge and/or instructional classroom experience working with children, adolescents and families from various socio-economic and cultural backgrounds;
- Possess flexibility, initiative and ability to work under pressure;



Minimum Requirements / Qualifications continued:

- Strong interpersonal, organizational, written and communication skills with colleagues, clients and representatives from other community organizations;
- Ability to work collaboratively with others and willingness to participate fully in a team process;
- Self-directing and ability to work independently as required;
- Ability to organize and prepare documentation in a timely manner;
- Strong commitment to working with a multi-cultural community;
- Demonstrable working knowledge of the use and operation of personal computers;
- Proof of passing a TB test and fingerprinting clearance (Live Scan);
- Proof of eligibility to work in the United States; and
- Physical requirements:
Ability to hear a child calling for help, ability to see a child on the playground, and inspect the field and written documents; ability to sit and stand for long periods of time; ability to communicate with KYCC staff, affiliates, clients and public; and dexterity of hands and fingers to operate office equipment.

Desired Qualifications:

- Knowledge and/or instructional experience in the operation of after-school and/or academic program(s);
- Experience in providing services to formerly homeless families or youth with learning disabilities;
- Bilingual capacity (English/Spanish);
- Certification in CPR (Youth & Adult) and First Aid training; and
- A valid Class C California Driver License, access to personal automobile, and proof of auto insurance.

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
