Summary: The Counselor II facilitates provision of quality in-home outreach counseling and case management services by providing education, linkage and support services. This position is under the supervision of the Clinical Services Manager and the Director of Children & Family Services who provide unit and administrative oversight as well as the Prevention Coordinator who provides oversight and support. Performance is reviewed on a continuous basis with specific goals and objectives identified throughout the year, including revenue generation goals. This is a full-time, exempt position.

Duties / Responsibilities:

- **Provide in-home outreach counseling by:**
 - Conducting intake and assessment of clients.
 - Conducting home visits and participating in family-centered case planning meetings to develop initial care plans, establishing the most appropriate case planning goals, and reviewing client's progress.
 - Assisting clients in implementing case plans by providing family support services including counseling, education and case management.
 - Accurately and timely documenting all activities including progress report and pre/post parent questionnaire.
 - Conducting outreach to promote program.
 - Coordinating care amongst other involved agencies.
 - Assisting with coordination and facilitation of events and groups to promote protective factors.
- **Attend relevant meetings, trainings, events and activities.**
- **Perform other related duties as assigned by the Clinical Services Manager.**

Minimum Requirements / Qualifications (All applicants MUST meet the minimum qualifications):

- A Master's degree in Social Work, Psychology, or related field from an accredited University.
- Minimum one(1) year experience providing social services to low-income children, youth and families from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds.
- **Bilingual capacity (English/Spanish), required.**
- Experience in the development and use of database application.
- Demonstrable working knowledge of the use and operation of personal computers.
- Strong commitment to working with a multicultural community.
- Strong organizational, written and communication skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively with others and a willingness to participate fully in the team process.
- Ability to organize and prepare documentation in a timely manner.
- Self-directing and the ability to work independently as required.
- Proof of passing a TB test and Live Scan fingerprint clearance.



- A valid California Driver License, access to personal transportation, and proof of auto insurance.
- Proof of eligibility to work in the United States.
- Physical requirements: Able to hear a child calling for help, able to see a child on the playground, able to sit for long periods of time, seeing to inspect the field and written documents; ability to communicate with KYCC staff, affiliates, clients and public; and dexterity of hands and fingers to operate office equipment.
