**Summary:** The Counselor I facilitates provision of quality outreach services by providing outreach, education, engagement and linkage services. This position is under the supervision of the Clinical Services Manager and the Program Coordinator who provide unit and administrative oversight and support. Performance is reviewed on a continuous basis with specific goals and objectives identified throughout the year, including revenue generation goals. This is a temporary full-time, non-exempt position working 40 hours a week. This position is expected to end **August 2021**.

#### **Duties / Responsibilities:**

- **Provide outreach by:**
  - Conducting outreach through government agencies, community-based organizations, churches, schools, businesses and other relevant sites.
  - Coordinating outreach amongst other agencies.
  - Conducting intake and screenings of potential clients.
  - Providing non-clinical crisis counseling and linkage services.
  - Accurately and timely documenting all outreach activities.
- **Attend relevant meetings and trainings:**
  - Attending relevant partner and collaborative meetings.
  - Attending monthly unit meetings.
  - Attending monthly and quarterly staff/agency meetings.
  - Attending professional development trainings, conferences, workshops and seminars in order to maintain and improve professional competence as assigned by the supervisor.
- **Perform other related duties as assigned by the Program Coordinator and/or Clinical Services Manager.**



**Minimum Requirements / Qualifications (All applicants MUST meet the minimum qualifications):**

- Minimum one(1) year experience providing social services, education, or outreach to low-income children, youth and families from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds.
- **Bilingual capacity (English/Korean) and/or (English/Spanish), required.**
- Demonstrable working knowledge of the use and operation of personal computers.
- Experience in the development and use of database applications.
- Ability to organize and prepare documentation in a timely manner.
- Strong commitment to working with a multicultural community.
- Strong organizational, written and communication skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively with others and a willingness to participate fully in the team process.
- Self-directing and the ability to work independently as required.
- Proof of passing a TB test and Live Scan fingerprint clearance.
- Proof of eligibility to work in the United States.
- A valid California Driver License, access to personal transportation, and proof of auto insurance.
- Physical requirements: Able to hear a child calling for help, able to see a child on the playground, able to sit for long periods of time, seeing to inspect the field and written documents; ability to communicate with KYCC staff, affiliates, clients and public; and dexterity of hands and fingers to operate office equipment.

**Desired Qualifications:**

- A Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Psychology, or related field from an accredited University or College.
- Certification in CPR (Child & Adult) and First Aid training.

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
