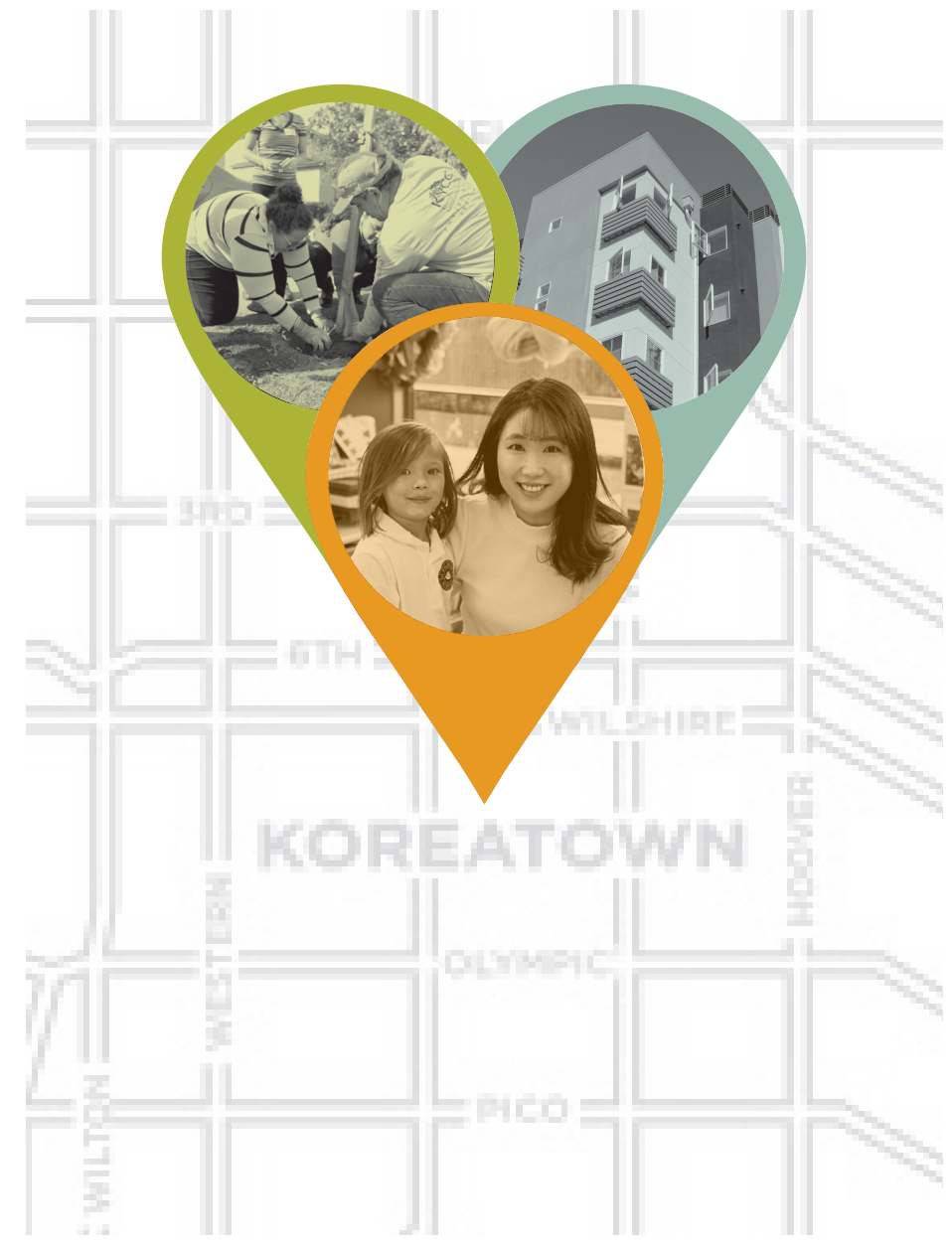

CLINICAL SERVICES

Mental health services for low-income youth and their families. Services include individual therapy, family therapy, parent education and coaching, medication management, and linkage to community resources. Speak with an intake counselor (English, Korean, or Spanish available).

PREVENTION AND AFTERCARE (P&A)

P&A helps families get linked to community resources such as parenting classes, mental health services, and concrete support. Families must have a child between 0-17, reside in Los Angeles County, and need help with linkage.

PARTNERSHIP FOR FAMILIES (PFF)

PFF is a home visitation program that includes counseling, concrete support, and linkage to community resources. To qualify, you must be pregnant or have at least one child, 5 years or younger, and have risk factors for child maltreatment. KYCC offers this program in Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean, and Tagalog. Other API languages can be serviced with an interpreter.

Grade level: K - 5th

ELEMENTARY PROGRAM

A daily after-school program for students in Kindergarten through 5th grade featuring activities for academic and social-emotional development.

Grade level: 6th - 8th

MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM (MSP)

A free after-school program where students get homework help from volunteer tutors and participate in enrichment activities (mentoring, art, college & career readiness, and more).

Grade level: 9th - 12th

BRIDGE

A volunteer program that recruits, trains, and places high school students to complete community service work directly with elementary and middle school after-school participants.

Grade level: K - 12th

SUMMER DAY CAMP

An all-day summer program where students preview academic subjects for the next school year and participate in enrichment activities. Enrollment is open to all students K-8th grade. Students 9-12th may apply to volunteer for community service hours through our BRIDGE program.
