Summary: The Counselor I facilitates provision of quality case management services for adults and children with developmental disabilities or have or are at-risk for a developmental delay or disability by providing education, linkage and support services. This position is a direct service position and is under the supervision of the Clinical Services Coordinator and Clinical Services Manager who will provide unit and administrative oversight and support. Performance is reviewed on a continuous basis with specific goals and objectives identified throughout the year, including revenue generation goals. This is a part-time, non-exempt position, typically working about 20 hours a week.

Duties / Responsibilities

- **Provide community health work by:**
 - Conducting intake and assessment of clients.
 - Conducting home/ office visits and participating in family- centered case planning meetings to develop initial care plans, establishing the most appropriate case planning goals and reviewing client's progress.
 - Assisting clients in implementing case plans by providing family support services.
 - Accurately and timely documenting all activities including progress reports and pre/ post parent questionnaire.
 - Coordinating care amongst other involved agencies.
- **Attend relevant meetings and trainings:**
 - Attending relevant partner and collaborative meetings.
 - Attend monthly unit meetings.
 - Attending monthly and quarterly staff/ agency meetings.
 - Attending professional development trainings, conferences, workshops and seminars in order to maintain and improve professional competence as assigned by the supervisor.
- **Perform other related duties as assigned by the supervisor.**



Minimum Requirements / Qualifications (All applicants MUST meet the minimum qualifications):

- **Bilingual capacity (English/Korean) is required.**
- Demonstrable working knowledge of the use and operation of personal computers.
- Experience in the development and use of database application.
- Ability to organize and prepare documentation in a timely manner.
- Strong commitment to working with a multicultural community.
- Strong organizational, written and communication skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively with others and a willingness to participate fully in the team process.
- Self-directing and the ability to work independently as required.
- Proof of passing a TB test and Live Scan fingerprint clearance.
- Proof of eligibility to work in the United States.
- A valid California Driver License, access to personal transportation, and proof of auto insurance.
- Physical requirements: Seeing to inspect written documents; ability to communicate with KYCC staff, clients and public; sitting, standing and walking for extended periods of time; bending, kneeling and reaching to retrieve and replace files; and dexterity of hands and fingers to operate office equipment; and ability to lift up to 40 lbs.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Minimum one (1) year (including field placement) experience providing social services to low-income individuals from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds.
- A Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Psychology, or related field from an accredited University or College.
- Certification in CPR (Child & Adult) and First Aid training.
