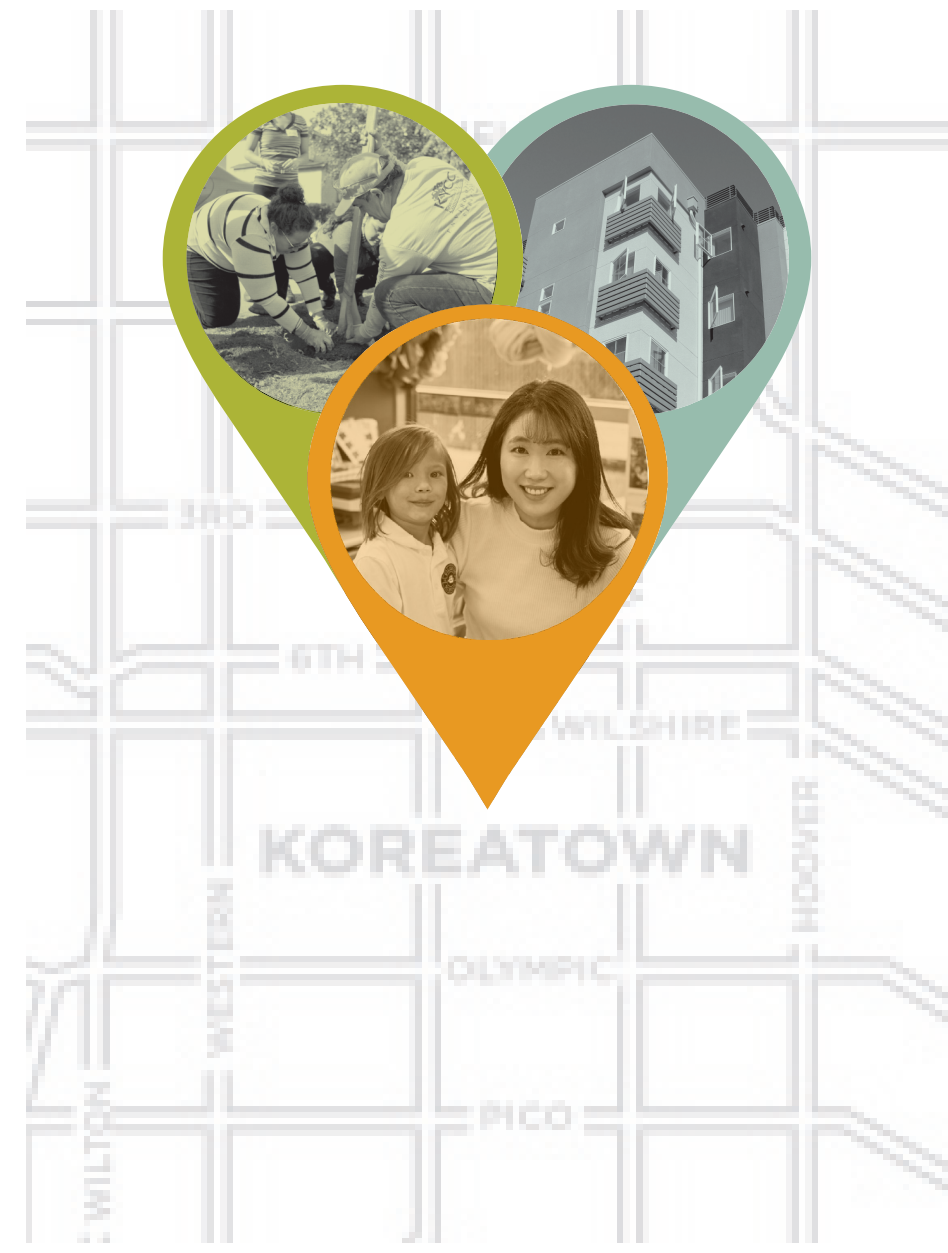

CLINICAL SERVICES

Mental health services for low-income youth and their families. Services include individual therapy, family therapy, parent education and coaching, medication management, and linkage to community resources. Services offered in English, Korean, or Spanish.

PREVENTION AND AFTERCARE (P&A)

Helps API families get linked to community resources such as parenting classes, mental health services, and concrete support. Families must have a child between 0-17, reside in LA County, and need help with linkage to community resources.

PARTNERSHIP FOR FAMILIES (PFF)

Home visitation program that includes counseling, concrete support, and linkage to community resources. To qualify, must be API, pregnant or have at least one child, 5 years or younger, and have risk factors for child maltreatment. Offered in Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean, and English. Other API languages can be serviced with an interpreter.

ASSET BUILDING PROGRAM

Helps families build emergency savings and personal credit through matched savings and lending circles.

FINANCIAL COACHING

Helps families understand their finances, resolve financial issues, and achieve financial goals.

FRESH START LOAN PROGRAM

Fresh Start Loan can help you establish new credit or add a positive record to your existing credit history. As an added bonus, you earn dividends as you pay off the loan.

CONSUMER ADVOCACY - UTILITIES

Helps families understand their rights as consumers and resolve any billing issues with home and cell phone, energy (SCE only), gas and internet service providers.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE (VITA)

VITA provides free income tax preparation to families making \$60,000 or less, IRS-trained and certified volunteers help prepare returns from late January to April.

LOW INCOME TAXPAYER CLINIC (LITC)

LITC educates low-income taxpayers on their taxpayer rights and responsibilities and provides pro bono legal tax representation to low-income taxpayers residing in Los Angeles County who have a tax debt of \$50,000 or less, per tax year.

SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Provides free one-on-one consulting services and workshops in planning, starting, and growing businesses in English, Korean and Spanish.

FREE RESIDENTIAL TREES

L.A. City residents are eligible to receive up to seven free shade trees for their homes.

FREE STREET TREES

Tree Planting crews plant free street trees throughout Koreatown, central, and South L.A.

GRAFFITI REMOVAL & BEAUTIFICATION

Removing graffiti and providing beautification through loose litter and weed abatement, seven days a week in Koreatown and neighboring communities. Requests for service can be made by calling the City hotline (311) or using the MyLA311 app or website.

YOUTH DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM (YDAPP)

A 10-month youth leadership program for high school students in the Koreatown, Pico-Union, and Westlake community. Members are trained to engage with their community and peers through substance use awareness and prevention.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

A 6–10 week prevention program for youth and parents, providing education on alcohol, drugs, and medication safety, while building communication, social, and refusal skills to strengthen resilience against substance use risks.

CoPALM

A coalition of providers, organizations, and community members in Metro LA dedicated to preventing alcohol, cannabis, and prescription medication misuse through education, mobilization, and policy advocacy to improve overall community health and well-being.

LIVING IN FREEDOM OF TOBACCO (LIFT)

LIFT aims to support the cities of Monrovia and La Mirada in adopting and implementing a Tobacco Retail Licensing (TRL) policy. This is done to reduce both tobacco products use and exposure amongst youth in both cities.

KOREATOWN, PICO UNION & WESTLAKE COMMUNITY INITIATIVE (KPWCI)

KPWCI serves economically disadvantaged youth and young adults from Koreatown, Pico-Union, and Westlake. Our program, Movement of Youth Protecting and Reviving Community (MYPARC), empowers young people through mentorship and internships that build advocacy and leadership skills, while increasing knowledge and awareness of substance use prevention and mental health initiatives. Through this work, we strive to uplift youth voices and strengthen our communities.

PREVENTION COMMUNITY COUNCIL (PCC)

A 10-month program for community members who want to learn about substance use prevention and support local efforts to keep families safe. Members share valuable resources, information, and opportunities that strengthen our neighborhoods.

RESPONSIBLE RETAILER CAMPAIGN

Aims to reduce underage drinking and prevent alcohol-related harms by partnering with liquor stores in Koreatown, Pico-Union, and Westlake. Partners participate in prevention efforts and receive information to prevent youth from purchasing alcohol products.

Treatment is individualized according to each person's needs and preferences toward successful long-term recovery. Medi-Cal or self-pay only.

Wilshire FSC supports low-income families in the City of LA through comprehensive social, educational, housing, and financial empowerment services. Programs include family support resources such as baby items, grocery distributions, parent workshops, and family activities; connections to LAUSD educational opportunities; housing assistance and referrals; and asset-building programs that help families strengthen savings, improve credit, and achieve long-term financial stability. Eligibility requirements include proof of income, valid ID, and proof of City of LA residency.

WILTON ELEMENTARY PROGRAM (TK-5TH)

An after-school program for TK-5th grade students that offers academic and enrichment activities—social emotional learning, creative learning and STEM.

WILTON MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM (6TH-8TH)

A free after-school program that provides middle school students with academic tutoring and enrichment activities—mentoring, creative learning, conflict resolution and college prep.

MENLO COLLEGE CORNER (6TH-12TH)

A free after-school program for middle and high school students offering tutoring, mentoring, college application assistance and career planning.

BRIDGE (9TH-12TH)

A student-led leadership program to empower high school students through hands-on experience and community service. The program develops life skills such as communication, responsibility, teamwork and problem-solving.

YOUTH WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

A program that offers paid internships for high school students and young adults. Participants gain hands-on work experience, develop career readiness skills, and explore various professional pathways.

SEASONAL CAMPS

An all-day summer, winter and spring program where students review academic subjects and participate in enrichment activities. Enrollment is open to TK-8th grade students. 9-12th grade students may apply to volunteer through our Bridge program.
